- monitoring

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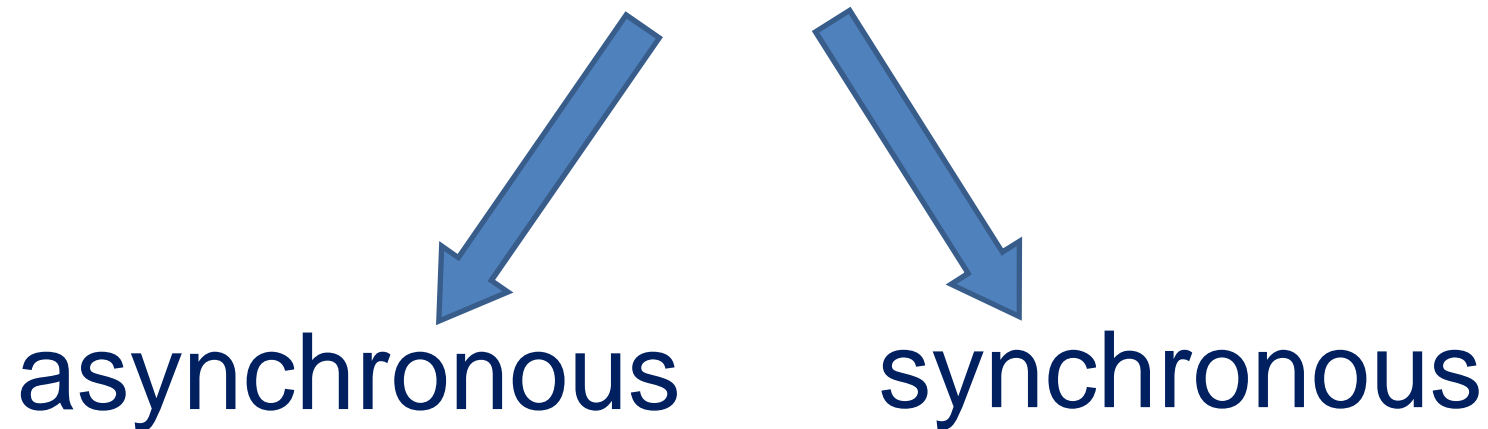
Distance Learning: technologies

- internet
→ e-learning / virtual learning

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Tools for asynchronous learning:

- Filesharing and content management (Sharepoint, [Dropbox](#), GoogleDocs..)
- Email / private messages
- Message boards / Forums
- Blogs

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Tools for synchronous learning:

- Chats (messengers, Hangout, etc.)
- Webconferences / Videoconferences (Anymeeting, Team Viewer, WebEx Meetings, Skype)
- Virtual class systems

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Tools for both asynchronous and synchronous learning:

- Collaborative writing (“wiki”)
- Social networks
